

Penelope is the new veiled chameleon in Mrs. A's room. Her species' natural habitat is southeastern Saudi Arabia and western Yemen. Here are some fun facts about veiled chameleons. They are omnivores meaning that they eat both plants and animals. Veiled chameleons are arboreal, meaning that they live on and around trees and large plants. Male veiled chameleons grow to be about 43 to 61 centimeters in length from snout to tail, females grow to be no more than 35 centimeters in length from snout to tail. Veiled chameleons are the most popular species of chameleon to be kept as a pet. Veiled chameleons have black spots when they are stressed or angry.
